These impact heavily on the living conditions of the country as wastes are dumped into more landfills, contaminate water and soil resources as well as contribute to severe air pollution. Based on an ADB report, "low solid waste collection efficiency and poor waste disposal have contributed to environmental and health risks highlighted by ground water and surface pollution, and water borne diseases."

Substantial amount of wastes can be diverted from the landfills and substantial savings could be generated if the 3R principle of "Reduce, waste management Reuse, and Recycle"- is seriously implemented. This involves increasing resource efficiency to waste at the promoting a re-use mindset rather than a throw-away culture and enhancing the recycling process and potential of products to be recycled. This approach offers positive society-wide benefits on health, livelihood and corporate profitability.
